QUEEN ELIZABETH STADIUM - THE OLYMPIC VENUE

The Olympic Park is located at the back of the Westfield Shopping Centre.

WESTFIELD - STRATFORD

With over 250 shops and 70 places to dine, Westfield Stratford is the largest shopping centre in Europe and a great destination to shop until you drop! Also an addition to the area is the change in location of London's Tech City, originally based around what is commonly known as the silicon roundabout in Shoreditch and Old Street areas.

MUSEUM OF LONDON - THE GREAT FIRE

Step back in time and visit the Museum of London with over 1.1 million objects. The 5 lower galleries of Modern London take you through the city from the the Great Fire of London to present day. See historic pieces from mock-up city streets and vintage cars - such as the Lord Mayor's State coach, still used today in the annual Lord Mayor's Show. Also, don't forget to not miss the fragments of the old London Wall located just outside the museum.
