CAMDEN - KENTISH TOWN, CHALK FARM, HIGHGATE



BELSIZE PARK, WEST HAMPSTEAD, ST JOHNS WOOD, SWISS COTTAGE, GOSPEL OAK, HOLBORI

With the landscaped gardens of Regent's Park, views of London from Primrose Hill, and the wilds, ponds and pools of Hampstead Heath, North West London boasts some of the Capital's most loved parkland. Meanwhile, cultural and sporting hotspots abound. Here you'll find Lord's Cricket Ground and London Zoo, as well as the Everyman Cinema, Hampstead Theatre and Regent's Park's beautiful mosque and Islamic Cultural Centre. There are attractive local high streets and excellent schools which attracts high calibre teachers, support staff, families, professional couples and celebrities, and St John's Wood in particular has an international appeal.



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Dubbed 'Queen of the Suburbs' in the 1880s, Ealing straddled the border between city and country and provided a semi rural retreat for wealthy Londoners. community's strength comes from the longevity of its residents, as

once house hunters have moved to Ealing they tend to stay. Ealing is also home to the largest Sikh temple outside India.

The North West of London is a well connected part of London. The arrival of Crossrail in 2018 is likely to increase and accelerate opportunities in the area. Travelling across London with an additional line will be easier than ever. Also with Victoria. Northern Line, Metropolitan Line, Circle, Piccadilly, Bakerloo, Jubilee and District, plus the use of Nationa Rail and overground hubs such as Victoria, Euston, Kings Cross, Willesden Junction and Marylebone - getting around the North West has become much easier.
